RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND: This item will be moved to the March meeting where the Clerk will present an up-to-date financial forecast. **Update from the March 2023 meeting and recommendations.** As per the above action the Clerk presented the current expenditure (see table below). Following this it was ascertained there is enough funding to allocate £1000 towards the Kings Coronation. Council noted lessons learned from the complications with the Queens Platinum Street grants, and therefore decided

141 Crime Update – CSO's A Sadzik and H Widlake attended on behalf of Gwent Police.

Carried forward from February 2023 meeting - Cllr D Nicholas raised the issue of damage to the war memorial in Deri. The issues seem to take place on the same evening as the youth club. PCO Widlake was aware of the reported incidents, and the Police have been liaising with the local wardens who take the lead on anti-social behaviour, and there have also been extra patrols in the area. Cllr E Blanche has a contact who has a network of CCTV to monitor fly tipping and offered to ask if they would consider installing one near the

memorial in Deri. Cllr Blanche said it would be an estimated cost of £250 and the Deri Regeneration Group who maintain the memorial could fund it by applying for a grant. Cllr D Nicholas asked the PCO if they would be in agreement with the CCTV, and he said it was a good idea as the Police can't be everywhere and this would be a good deterrent.

RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND: Cllr Blanche will discuss the CCTV with his contact and report back at the next meeting. Move to April 2023 meeting as Cllr Blanche unable to attend meeting as working away. Cllr A Sadzik will also get some more information and feedback at the next meeting.

- CSO R Pearce sent the Clerk a crime updates via email prior to the meeting. This included the Darran Valley Council Figures for February 2023

- Further Context:
- 2 x Criminal Damage incidents relate to;
- House egged in the Fochriw area happened at around midnight, no persons witnessed by caller & no CCTV on property.
- Damage to Memorial Garden Deri, whereby plants were pulled up from beds and a large amount of litter discarded - suspected to be youths, however the incident was not witnessed and at the time there was no CCTV covering the area.
- 1 x Burglary relates to;
- Shed break in the Fochriw area where an electric mountain bike was stolen – CCTV & H2H enquiries conducted with a negative result.
- ASB Figures
- 31 Incidents of ASB across all Rhymney Wards for the month of February.
- 1 of which occurred within the Darran Valley Ward.
- ASB call related to a group of unknown male youths, (no descps given) banging doors and running away on Bailey Street, Deri – caller stated that the incident had happened 45 minutes & that the youths had since moved on from the area, so no units dispatched.

- Ref Deri Memorial Garden team have liaised with Cllr Chapman and provided a report to CCBC CCTV department to support the installation of a CCTV camera in the area.
- The area & surrounding streets also form part of NPTs patrol plan, following the incidents of damage at the garden and reports from residents of ASB in the surrounding streets.
- 2 x off road bike operations planned for March & April with partner agencies. Mainly covering the common but officers will also pay observations within the villages of Deri & Fochriw & at Parc Cwm Darran.
- CSOs are recommencing Police Surgeries at Deri Community Centre from March. This month's surgery will be held on Monday 27th March between 5-5.30pm. Residents of Darran Valley are invited to come along to discuss/ raise any community issues / concerns they may have with members of the team. This will be conducted on a '1 2 1' basis rather than as a meeting to maintain confidentiality.

There was a wider discussion regarding the setting up of a pilot in Rhymney to start a youth hub for ages 13-17. This will target young people who are not interested in attending youth clubs and include drinks, a pool table etc. The Police are building up a good relationship with the young people in Rhymney and asked if we could think of a way of setting this up in the Darran Valley.

RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND: Discuss further at the April meeting to think of how this could work in this area and the best ways of engaging with young people in the Darran Valley Area. Direct engagement with the youth clubs and feedback on what worked and didn't in Rhymney will also be fed back via the CSO's.
