78 Darran Valley Community Council Crime Update

A representative from Gwent police attended. Throughout the month of October there was an overall decrease in both crime and anti-social behavior incidents. There were 10 crimes and 7 anti-social behavior incidents in the Darran Valley. The 'Anti-social behavior – your guide' leaflets were handed to members of the council, and some were left at the community centre for members of the public.

- The force wide operation harley is still on-going and targeting the antisocial use of off-road bikes.
- 1 male from Fochriw was remanded for drug supply and conspiracy to steal motor vehicles.
- 1 male from Pontlloftyn who's partner lives in Fochriw was remanded for drug supply.
- Five men, aged between 19 and 27 were arrested on suspicion of class A and B drug supply offences following a day of action in Fochriw.
- 1 male was arrested for 4 thefts of diesel in Pontlloftyn.
- Sur-ron E-bikes reported to be more frequent in Deri.

Engagement – Rhymney NPT attended the annual Heddlu Bach interview stages at Fochriw Primary (AM Dawn Bowden was also in attendance). All candidates passed their Q&A and were welcomed to the team.

79 To receive Community Council Correspondence

79.01 The Independent Remuneration Panel for Wales sent a notification that Councils must either pay their members £52 a year for the cost of office consumables required to carry out their role, or alternatively Councils must enable members to claim full reimbursement for the cost of office consumables.

79.02 Participatory Budgeting (GAVO) – Cllr J Gibbings sent details to the Clerk.

RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND: Following a discussion the Clerk will Set up a meeting before the December 2023.

79.03 The Clerk received an e-mail from 'One Voice Wales' regarding free webinars and training available to members.

Cllr Gibbings has the bus company contacts who may be able to offer a better price if the trip is booked earlier. The Fochriw questionnaires are still being collated by Cllr D Johnson.

RESOLVED TO RECOMMEND: As soon as all the questionnaires are returned this item will return for discussion and agreement.
